* To qualify for the Early Bird Fee, individuals must pay in full by **June 15, 2010**. To qualify for the Early Bird Fee, a unit must estimate their attendance numbers at registration time and pay at least a \$100 deposit by **April 15, 2010**, and pay in full, less the deposit, by **June 15, 2010**. A policy change on February 6, 2010 has been implemented that will allow a unit to add an additional three participants after the June 15 deadline but before September 1, 2010, at the Early Bird Fee, provided they have met "all" the Early Bird criteria by June 15.

† Ancillary Staff are those individuals acting in support roles, i.e. vendors, helpers, corporate displays, health and safety personnel, etc. These individuals will not be attending or participating in events, nor attending the Arena Show without purchasing a separate Arena Show ticket. No camping is anticipated for this class of staff. If you plan on camping, you must register as Full Staff.

Note: These prices are only for the Campaganza event and do not include any meals. All food is the responsibility of the units and individuals.

Tiger Cubs who are recruited after 9/1/2010 will be able to register at a \$35.00 per person fee.

Please bring your paid receipt to expedite the check-in process.

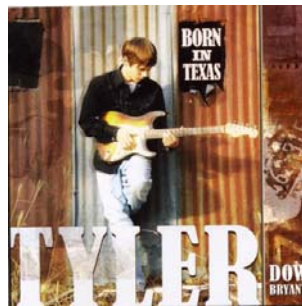

* We're providing skill specific events in each discipline at all scout levels. For Cub Scouts we'll have BB Guns, Archery, and Sling Shot (at the state park) with 24 shooting positions located in 3 ranges for each discipline for a total of 72 positions on 9 ranges. We'll have a briefing station for each range and range shooting periods of 15 minutes. That's 870 periods for 9 hours for over 7,800 shooting slots, i.e. participation periods. For Boy Scouts\Venturers (at Moraine Sportsman's Club via shuttle) we'll have Rifle, Shotgun, Muzzleloader, Handguns (Venturers only), and Atlatl which adds up to 14,000 shooting slots. Between the two we'll have almost 22,000 planned event periods.
